







Follow these pictures to learn Mandarin (or even Taiwanese)

The characters that appear here beneath the English are a little different – the entire character set is the same, but I might substitute one character for another – because here is the Taiwanese translation. (The one above shown with superscripts is Mandarin Chinese.) (Mandarin and Taiwanese are both Chinese dialects.)(Mandarin had been used in today's Beijing area before it was mandated to be the national language of China.)(But that government was forced by the Communists to retreat to Taiwan and became the Taiwanese government in 1949.)(Therefore, there are two Chinas today: one in Mainland China, and the other one in Taiwan.)(The Formosa Groups of Corporations come from Taiwan.)</p> <p>9. I put Taiwanese here because the purpose of the project was to utilize the Taiwanese system that I proposed and thought to be the most simple to use. (But nobody paid attention. 😊)</p>
